

Image Resolution and your digital images

The resolution of a digital image refers to how many pixels or dots per inch (dpi) make up the image. High resolution is good for printing images, but it results in a large file size, so it is not recommended for sending via e-mail to family and friends.

Here is a brief guide to image resolution:

72 dpi	Low Resolution - standard for viewing images on Web pages or sending via e-mail.
300 dpi	Medium Resolution - good for printing. Images at this resolution can be e-mailed, but due to large file size it will take time to download the image.
600 dpi	High Resolution - best for printing. It is not recommended to send high resolution images via e-mail.
